**Pilgrimage to Ripon**-Save the date: Wednesday 18th October 2017. You may remember that last year the Bishop inaugurated an annual pilgrimage to Ripon Cathedral in honour of one of the principal patrons of our diocese, This Mass will again be the culmination of our new pilgrimage 'Camino': **St Wilfrid's Way**. Beginning with a Pilgrims' Mass at Leeds Cathedral on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> October, and continuing from Knaresborough on Tuesday, 17<sup>th</sup>, pilgrims may either walk all or part of the way, or otherwise travel all or any part of the route using their own or public transport. In Knaresborough we have been granted on all three days of the pilgrimage the rare opportunity to visit the tiny mediaeval Chapel of Our Lady of the Crag and to hear Mass there. **St Wilfrid's Way** ends in Ripon in time for the 11am Mass on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> in the Cathedral.
